Our Town Clerk is going to describe the system in another part of this newsletter so I will say no more except to re-iterate that no rules were broken. Voting was done in full view of all present by the showing of hands so assuredly, Democracy is still at work in the Chamber.

*There are several groups of people working hard to complete a Health Check for the town which means all aspects of our town are being looked at in detail and before the year is out, we will have a consolidated report. The very well attended public Sports Facility meeting held in April will feed into that. The Health Check will be of enormous advantage when it is finished as it will provide evidence to whatever body we might need to apply for grants in the future.*

*Besides this huge project, The Town Council has already made a bid for money to improve Haspalls Road Recreation Ground, we will be negotiating on how best to sell the allotment land, the Swimming Pool project will soon be reaching a more exciting stage, the Sixth form Centre will be on the market as will the old Corn Exchange so there are exciting times ahead this year. We are certainly going to be busy.*

*On Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> June, a plaque in memory of all service personnel from the area who have lost their lives since the Second World War will be unveiled on the War Memorial by the Lord Lieutenant of Norfolk. Thanks to the Royal Naval Association and the Royal British Legion for this project. Further details in the local paper.*

## MAYOR'S ELECTION - THE FACTS

You may have read articles in the local press (EDP & Lynn News) and in their letters columns regarding the Mayoral elections in May this year. Well if it is in the newspaper then it must be true! But there is nothing like the facts to spoil a good story is there?

**Informal Meetings:** In recent years since 2003 the Council have had an informal meeting in a private session prior to the annual Mayor making election in May. The purpose of such meetings is:

- to agree nominations in advance for Deputy Mayor and/or Mayor
- to enable unanimous nominations to go forward for the Mayoral elections
- to show to the public that the Council are unified in support of the Mayor & Deputy Mayor
- to avoid embarrassment of not receiving many votes

**This Year:** There were two informal meetings this year on 17<sup>th</sup> March and 30<sup>th</sup> April respectively. A vote was taken at the second meeting on both the Mayor and Deputy Mayor. But as no formal minutes are taken at informal meetings the decision was not legal and binding. Nominations could still be made at the May Council meeting, gentleman's agreement or not? The fact that the Deputy Mayor was unable to stand for Mayor this year provided a further complication as in the previous two years. This was regarded as another extraordinary year.

**Any questions?** The following have been the most popular asked so far:

- *Is it legal for the Council to have the same Mayor three years in a row?* **YES**
- *Is it normal practice for Swaffham Town Council to have the same Mayor three years in a row?* **NO**
- *Are there rules for alternating political parties to elect the Mayor?* **NO**
- *Is it legal to suspend the Council's Standing Orders?* **YES**

There has been much more said about this issue where it has seemed that everyone has and is entitled to their opinion. **So where do we go from here** might be your final question? Well standing orders are under review and clearly this is an issue that needs to be addressed otherwise it raises the question of why have standing orders at all? Informal discussions are sometimes necessary but maybe it is time to combine them with a more formal conclusion.

**The reason** agreed by the majority of Councillors for putting forward the Mayor for a third term, was that whoever was chosen as Mayor would make a better Mayor if they had the benefit of being Deputy for a year. This of course can be argued both ways, but the decision to elect the Mayor this year was a democratic one.

## RECREATION GROUND

The committee has put in a grant application to WREN to apply for £250,000 to build a log cabin has been submitted to WREN. The log cabin will provide facilities that will include toilets, a community room, youth room and a kitchen. The committee will now have to wait until July to find out if it has passed the 1<sup>st</sup> stage. If the committee passes the 1<sup>st</sup> stage then the final outcome will not be known until December.

The committee were successful in obtaining a £50,000 grant from the Big Lottery . This money will be used to provide a new toddler/junior play area on the Rec. This project will start in July and will be completed by the 7<sup>th</sup> August.

## Town Group – Progress Report

The Swaffham Town Group has made great progress in recent months. A highly successful workshop event was held in April, which attracted extremely positive feedback from participants from Breckland District Council and the Norfolk Rural Community Council. The four Working Groups (Economy, Environment, Social/Community and Transport) are currently finalising their reports and making suggestions as to the content of an Action Plan for Swaffham. Two action projects have already emerged. These are outlined below and require volunteers to take them forward. ### Call for volunteers 1

#### Cycling and Walking Project Group

A working group looking at ways of improving facilities for cyclists and pedestrians in Swaffham is currently being set up. This group requires volunteers to get involved and come up with ideas for projects and initiatives which will make Swaffham a better place for cyclists and pedestrians. Surveys run by the Swaffham Town Group revealed that:

- there are high levels of dissatisfaction with provision for cyclists including route access, safety and lack of secure bike racks
- whilst the town centre is seen as generally OK for pedestrians, links across town are not always very good.

The project group will look at ways confronting some of the problems, for example; identifying areas which can be 'dual use' pathways; promoting cycling/walking in new developments; looking at ways of promoting cycling to schools; improving availability of secure bike racks in key locations; look at examples of best practice from elsewhere and identifying funding opportunities.

### Call for Volunteers 2

#### National Lottery Townscape Heritage Initiative (THI)

A bid to the THI fund is currently under consideration. This fund provides grants for the regeneration of urban conservation areas with the aims of: 1) preserving and enhancing the character and appearance of conservation areas that are in need of regeneration; 2) bringing historic buildings back into appropriate and sustainable use. Schemes should also provide significant benefits for local communities, especially those suffering from disadvantage. In order to put together a bid we need

## ALLOTMENTS

The contractors have completed work on the access tracks to allotments off Princes Street and Tumbler Hill. This includes the creation of a car park area in a central location within each of the two major allotment sites. Thanks are due to the Football Club who allowed the contractors to store materials in their car park. The Council will consider upgrading the remaining tracks in future years as funds allow.

It is good to see the allotments starting to flourish with either new allotment holders or those that have moved from Days Field or Shoulder of Mutton. There are still some allotment holders who are not cultivating their allotment sites and these will be targeted in the coming months. It is not fair on those that are tending their allotments properly to have an eyesore next door creating weeds etc.

There are still a few jobs in hand, some fences to mend and gates to install but the retained allotments are in general in better shape now than they have been for some while now.

## MARKET

There have been two successful themed Markets held recently. First of all the French Market held on 20<sup>th</sup> April and an Italian Market on 1<sup>st</sup> June. Both Markets are now looking to establish a regular visit to Swaffham at least twice a year. They are both returning in the Autumn, but no dates have been confirmed at the time of going to print.

The Saturday Market continues to battle on, with a re-organisation of the central area taking place just recently. We thank the traders for their co-operation in this regard and hope this will prove to be a success in the longer term. There are still gaps to fill and the Committee are working hard to try and bring the Market back up to its full quota of stalls.

## Northwell Pool

The ducks at Northwell Pool are remarkably controversial creatures, as we found out through the Northwell Pool consultation exercise in 2006. Some of you adore our feathered friends, whilst to others they are a nuisance when they foul people's paths and congregate in gardens. Some people like to go along to Northwell Pool and feed them bread. However, this does cause problems. It has been evident that the rat population in the Northwell Pool area has exploded this spring. The main reason for this is the availability of an easy food source: the bread. These rats are causing concern for local residents and are potentially a public health hazard. The Town Council and Anglian Water have now hired Pest Control contractors to tackle the rat problem. However, whilst there is an abundant supply of food there will always be rats in the area.

We would ask that people pay attention to the following points if they want to feed the ducks:

- 1) Please do not throw bread down if there is already bread laying around.
- 2) Please do not feed in the late afternoon or evening as piles of bread laying around overnight will definitely attract rats.
- 3) Please do not over feed - sometimes people throw down several loaves in one go, which will inevitably lead to surplus laying around.
- 4) Please dispose of bread bags properly. It is shocking to see bread bags floating in the pond because people cannot be bothered to put them in a bin or take them away.
- 5) Note that the RSPB recommend that birds are not regularly fed bread as it is low in the nutrients that they require to be healthy.

We have heard reports of cruelty to the ducks and ducklings. We would be grateful if any sightings of such behaviour are reported to the local Police. It is an offence to harm a bird or animal. The area around Northwell Pool is a priority area for the Community Police team but they can only act if they are provided with information.

The Town Council County Council and Anglian Water are investing in the environment at Northwell Pool to make the place more attractive for residents and visitors but we all need the co-operation of the public to keep problems to a minimum. It would be great if problems like litter, petty vandalism and rats could be reduced through the efforts of the community so that we can then invest resources into exciting, new enhancement projects rather than corrective ones.
