Outline planning permission has been granted by the planning authority (Breckland District Council) to Swaffham Town Council for a Leisure Building which will include a swimming pool. The site is next to the Eco-tech and Waitrose. The Town Council can now go ahead with the land purchase of this site on behalf of the Swimming Pool Association who will be seeking funding for the building of Swaffham's long awaited swimming pool.

### **Fighting Fly-Tipping**

In the past 12 months street scene removed around 600 incidents of fly-tipping within 24 hours of them being reported. The most common types of flytipped waste are items like fridges, cookers and mattresses which can all be taken free of charge to your local Norfolk County Council recycling center. Please ring 0844 800 8004 for more details. Or alternatively, you can phone us and arrange for them to be collected from outside your house. We have to charge £20 for this but that includes up to 3 items and it saves you having to take them to the site yourself.

New laws mean you are now responsible for your waste so make sure any private waste removal company you use is authorized - otherwise if your waste ends up on the side of the road then you could be liable for the fine.
